Introduction

The KTC Israel Experience is an opportunity to learn, grow, and represent our school community with pride. Dress and appearance on tour reflect tznius, self-respect, and respect for the places and people we will encounter. This policy sets clear expectations for the dress code when students are in Israel. It applies throughout the trip, including travel days, touring, evenings, Shabbos, free time, hotels, and any programmed activity.

By participating in the trip, students agree to follow this policy at all times. Where judgement is required, chaperones will have final discretion.

General Dress Code

Tops

- Neat and Tidy
- Long or short sleeves tops - no sleeveless tops or singlets

Bottoms

- Long pants to be worn
- Shorts are not permitted

Neatness & Condition

- Clothing must be clean, neat, and intact
- No rips, distressing, frays, or excessive wear

Logos & Slogans

- Keep small and discreet
- No political, provocative, or inappropriate graphics

Shabbos & Special Evenings

- Shabbos-appropriate button down shirt and dress pants
- Shabbos-appropriate jacket / sweater or suit
- T-shirts, casual pants i.e track suit pants and hoodies are not appropriate for Shabbos



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Kippah, Tzitzis & Davening

- A kippah must be worn at all times
- Hat and jacket for Davening according to your custom
- Tzitzis are to be worn daily

Compliance

Quick visual checks may occur before departures. If an item of clothing does not meet this policy, the student will be asked to change. Our goal is simple: comfort, Kavod, and being trip-ready. Please help keep the mood positive by packing to the guide and checking with a chaperone if you're unsure.
